



# Mental Health Service Provision for Working Age Adults in England 2002

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### Introduction

This Atlas reports the findings of the 2002 Mental Health Service Mapping exercise. The exercise was set up in 2000 as part of the process of monitoring the implementation of the mental health national service framework (NSF) in England but the resultant national database of services has been found to have many other uses and has become a valued source of information for a wide range of service planners, managers, practitioners and users.

The service mapping describes the facilities and services provided for adults of working age with mental health problems. It was designed to enable changes in provision to be tracked as mental health services are developed and realigned to the models set out in the NSF and to monitor progress towards equity of access to services. The mapping has a number of key characteristics:

- It is an annual exercise with the data being updated every autumn
- A holistic approach has been taken to reflect the complexity of mental health services. The mapping draws together information about both health and social care mental health services provided in the statutory and independent sectors.
- Data is collected at the level of individual services. For each service, information such as service type, location, targeting, capacity and staffing is gathered.
- Services are located geographically enabling reports to be generated for a range of administrative areas. These include areas that are the responsibility of Local Implementation Teams (LIT), Primary Care Trusts (PCT), Strategic Health Authorities (SHA) and councils with social services responsibilities (CSSR). In addition reports can be run on the basis of NHS provider trusts.
- The database is readily accessible to anyone with a web browser. The data are both collected on the Internet and maintained live on the Durham University website to be interrogated and revised at any time. A leading figure in each LIT has password access to their LIT site and bears responsibility for seeing that their LIT data are updated.

With these characteristics, the mental health service mapping is an ambitious undertaking. At a local level, it requires a great deal of goodwill and cooperation to ensure data is accurately and systematically collected from its diverse sources. At a national level the principle challenge last year was to respond to the changing geography of NHS management and LITs.

### Geography of NHS management and LITs

Unlike SHA and PCTs which are delineated by the Government, LITs are locally configured and can be changed by local agreement. 2002 saw the disillusion of NHS Executive offices and the emergence of SHA and PCTs as the key planners, commissioners and performance managers. In response the number of LITs increased from 128 in 2001 to 160 in 2002 with many aligning themselves to PCT boundaries, or to groups of PCTs. As no national register of LITs has been kept up until now, keeping up with changes in LIT names, boundaries, populations and lead officers proved to be a major task.

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So why is the mapping structured on such an unstable base? The answer lies in the complex nature of mental health service provision and the radical vision set out in the mental health NSF. The services promoted in the NSF require provision by numerous agencies and have a wide range of stakeholders who should have a say in their planning. Local Implementation Teams were established as the vehicle for that planning. Stress was placed on the importance of keeping planning local and the NSF envisaged that LITs would be most effective if they could operate over areas determined locally. The LIT area that would be convenient for one locality might not suit another. Consequently, the LITs set up in 2000 varied widely in size and character. These have since been overtaken by the implementation of Shifting the Balance of Power in 2002 and a new pattern of LITs have emerged. These are continuing to change as the new NHS economies settle in. So one of the cost of ensuring flexibility in the areas covered by LITs has been instability.

As the implementation of the NSF is monitored on a LIT basis, it is important that the service mapping retains the LIT structure. Therefore, this is a LIT Atlas. Findings are reported by LIT and grouped by SHA to support the performance monitoring role of these authorities. In each table, SHA are listed alphabetically and, within SHAs, LITs are similarly ordered. A total for England is given at the end of the tables.

### **Accuracy and reliability**

A great deal of effort has been put into increasing the accuracy of the mapping data. A number of warnings have been introduced to alert people inputting data of gaps or improbable figures, and the mapping team undertakes a lot of data scrutiny. The returns are examined in two ways: a) to ensure service items have been properly categorised; and b) to assess whether the data looks plausible. In some instances we have tried to establish whether the apparent absence of some types of service accurately reflects the position. However the data should be read with care. This was only the second year that data has been collected using the Internet and this method of data collection is still developmental. Also, in a year of major change in health services, many of the personnel responsible for collecting and inputting the mapping data were new to the task and have had to familiarise themselves with the process.

Three particular issues with the accuracy of the Atlas tables should be highlighted.

1. The database contains incomplete records. The information that was missing from 2002 data revisions tended to be capacity data such as caseload, referrals and bedspaces. Where a LIT reported having a service but returned no capacity data, this is shown in the capacity column of the Atlas tables as a zero. A dash in the cell denotes no service. However, where data have been inconsistently returned, provided for some services and not others, it may not be possible to distinguish this from the summary tables. It may only be apparent to those who are familiar with local circumstances.
2. Similarly in a database the size of the mapping database (over 12,000 service entries) it is easy for errors in the data to go undetected. Again, it is only when the data is used by people who know the situation that such errors may be identified.

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3. Difficulties have been encountered with the concept of 'external provision and purchase'. As has been mentioned above, LITs have been devised as local planning areas and are not intended to reflect the catchments areas of service providers. Therefore a single service may be used by the residents of a number of LITs. For example, an acute inpatient facility may be centrally placed for residents of more than one LIT, or an assertive outreach service may be set up to provide a service to two neighbouring LITs. An attempt was made in the 2002 mapping to avoid the double counting of any of these services by identifying which LIT the service was located in, how much of the service was used by the LIT population and how much of the service capacity was provided for another LIT. The other LIT using the services was then expected to indicate that it was 'externally purchasing' this service from its neighbouring LIT. Only partial success was achieved in this aspect of the mapping and more development work is planned. In the Atlas, services used jointly with another LIT and provided externally to the LIT have been indicated with an asterisk.

In order to enable ongoing improvements to data accuracy to be made, all users of the data are encouraged to question the findings and to report any suspected data inaccuracies. To facilitate this questioning, means of pinpointing errors and communicating these to those with responsibility for inputting the data have been introduced.

- If 'data summary' tables are run on the website using the 'with links' facility, the data source of any table entry can be obtained by clicking on the LIT name. This will drill down into the database and give all the details entered about each service. There it is easy to identify where the error is being generated.
- To enable mapping users to report concerns with the data, a contact email address has been provided for each LIT. This is listed at the head of each service entry and at a number of other places within the mapping web page.

### Trends

Changes in the content of the mapping exercise between 2000 and 2002 have been kept to a minimum to maximise the ability of the mapping to capture shifts in national service provision. However, the widespread changes in health and LIT areas have thwarted year-on-year comparisons. To overcome this, 2001 LITs have been assigned to 2002 strategic health authorities and data queries have been set up which enable comparisons of returns at the level of SHAs. SHA trend tables have been included in the Atlas for CMHTs, assertive outreach teams and crisis resolution teams. For other services, national comparisons have been made in the introductory text to services.

An important difference between 2001 and 2002 data is the period for which referral data was collected. The widespread changes in trust configuration occurring in April 2002 lead us to conclude, on the basis of consultation, that one year referral figures from agencies which had only been established for 6 months at the time of the mapping would cause problems. Therefore, all referral data was requested for the 3-month period April through June 2002 only. All other capacity data collected remained as before.

### Atlas tables

The presentation of tables had been changed in this atlas not only to respond to the introduction of strategic health authorities but also to present the data as economically as possible given that 160 LITs in 28 SHA generate very long tables. The styles of tables presented include:

- Complete LIT tables giving totals for SHA and a national total at the end of the table
- Sparse tables which only include LITs which have services of the type in question. All redundant rows in the table are removed and LITs with no services are listed at the end. However, in the SHA and national summary rows total populations are retained. Tables 6b onwards are presented in this format.
- Trend tables give SHA totals for the years 2001 and 2002. These are only provided in sections 1-3.

### The Durham mapping team

Following the inception of the idea for mental health service mapping by Cathy Borowy and others in the Department of Health, the current form was devised and developed at Durham University by Gyles Glover and Di Barnes from the Centre for Public Mental Health and Keith Bennett and Steven Bradley from the Department of Computer Sciences. The team have continued to be commissioned by the Department of Health to maintain the database and to report on its content. They are also working to further develop its scope and its interrogation capabilities.

The Durham Team are acutely aware that the whole project succeeds only through the active participation and hard work of many other people, from LIT data collectors to our commissioning group in the Department of Health. To all these we are grateful.

This Atlas only gives a flavour of the tables which can be generated. Even with some health warning on the accuracy of the data, the scope for extracting information from the mapping is enormous. More can be seen on the mapping website and the Durham team is interested in hearing what type of information and analysis would be of use to you.

## 1. Community mental health teams

There is evidence in the 2002 service mapping that CMHTs remain the backbone of community mental health care in England. All LITs reported having at least one team. Nationally there were 846 services (Table 1a) employing more than 13,000 WTE care staff supporting a caseload of over 300,000 individuals. As would be expected there was considerable variation in the rate of caseload to care staff over the country and within SHA.

As this was the second year that the mapping data has been collected in this format, it is possible to look at emerging trends (Table 1b and c) but in interpreting these tables, account must be taken of the improved data returns in 2002. For example, the total number of CMHTs listed has reduced from 931 in 2001 to 846, and while there has undoubtedly been some consolidation of CMHTs, more rigorous data checks and familiarity with the system has also led to more accurate designation of community teams. Greater care has been taken to distinguish appropriately between CMHTs and specialist teams and/or worker which target particular needs have been otherwise assigned.

Similarly, caseload information, which was particularly patchy in 2001, was been provided for all but 8 LITs last year. This could in part account for the 5,000 increase in caseload. However, the findings suggest that:

- The number of CMHTs is reducing
- Teams are increasing in size – care staff in CMHTs have increased from 13,000 in 2001 to 13,500 in 2002
- Average caseloads appear to be rising although redesignation of teams may account for this.

Table 1c shows that the move to integrated management in CMHTs is progressing well. The proportion of fully integrated teams which was just 17% in 2000, rose to 29% in 2001 and has now risen to 45%.

### CMHTs

A Community Mental Health Team is a multidisciplinary team offering specialist assessment, treatment and care to adults with mental health problems in their own homes and the community. CMHTs may provide a whole range of community-based services themselves, or be complemented by one or more teams providing specific functions.

To be **fully integrated**, a CMHT must have:

- interagency multidisciplinary staff involving health and social services
- single operational management for all staff within the team regardless of employing agency
- integrated assessment, care planning and care co-ordination
- joint recording and IT systems.

### Multi Agency CMHTs:

CMHTs which are interagency but have not yet achieved full integration.

### Single Agency Teams:

CMHTs which are staffed and managed by a single agency. These teams may be multi-disciplinary insofar as they contain staff from more than one discipline, but teams will be managed and staffed by either a social services department or NHS trust but not by health and social services together.

## 2. Assertive outreach teams

The number of assertive outreach teams (AOT) has continued to grow but the rate of development has slowed as the target of 220 teams set out in the NHS Plan and Improvement Expansion and Reform<sup>1</sup> has been approached. There were 130 AOT teams in 2000. This increased to 180 teams in 2001 and 194 services in 2002. National coverage remains at about 80% of LITs either with a team, or sharing a team with a neighbouring LIT (marked \* on Table 2a). Where AOTs have not been developed, the staff of CMHTs provided the function in a further 10% of LITs, leaving only 10% of LITs with no assertive outreach service.

Returns suggest that, although the data accuracy is better than last year, there are still teams reported with staffing levels evidently unequal to the task of meeting all the requirements of the AOT model of service. Overall, 194 AOTs employed almost 1,600 WTE care staff who supported a caseload of over 7800. This was a minimum caseload figure as some data was missing but it does confirm a low case-per-staff ratio nationally reflecting the policy of no more than 12 cases per staff member.

Reductions in the number of AOT shown in the trend table 2c reflects the removal of teams which were double counted in 2002 and more stringent use of the criteria defining AOTs. The trend table (Table 2d) shows that while AOTs are moving towards fidelity to the service model for assertive outreach services (see definition) there are still major difficulties in meeting the requirement to have staff available in the evenings and at weekends and to provide an 24/7 on call service. Only 66% of AOTs are accessible outside traditional office hours and only 20% are on call nights and weekends.

### **Definition: Assertive Outreach Team**

Assertive Outreach Teams, known also as 'assertive community treatment teams', provide intensive support for the severely mentally ill people who are 'difficult to engage' in more traditional services. Many will often have a forensic history and a dual diagnosis. Care and support is offered in their homes or some other community setting, at times suited to them. Workers can be involved in direct delivery of practical support, care co-ordination and advocacy as well as more traditional therapeutic input. The aim of the service is to maintain contact and increase engagement and compliance.

Assertive outreach teams should have the following characteristics:

1. a team approach (not intensive care management by individual members of community mental health teams)
2. a team caseload no larger than 12 service users for each member of staff
3. a defined client group
4. planned long-term working with individuals
5. much of the work outside a service setting
6. evening and weekend availability with
7. 24 hour access to an on-call system for service users on the team caseload.

### 3. Crisis resolution teams

The number of crisis resolution teams (CRT) rose to 61 in 2002 from 52 in 2001 (Table 3c). Access to CRT remained patchy with 115 LITs (72%) reporting no service (Table 3a). A further 112 home treatment services were provided as a function of CMHTs but 40 LITs (25%) had no home treatment service.

Altogether over 800 staff were employed in CRT. The average caseloads carried by teams represented a case-per-staff ratio of 2.1. In Table 3a, SHA and national caseload figures were depressed by caseload data being missing from 10% of services.

As with assertive outreach teams, CRTs were moving closer to fidelity with the service model (see definition). 90% of teams were providing intensive contact compared to 81% the previous year and 85% were working with service users until issues were resolved compared to 73% in 2001 (Tables 3b & d). Problems remained in providing a 24/7 service (52% of teams) and the proportion of teams which were non multi-disciplinary remained almost constant at 72%.

#### **Definition: Crisis Resolution Team**

A crisis resolution team (sometimes called home treatment) provides intensive support for people in mental health crisis in their own home: they stay involved until the problem is resolved. It is designed to provide prompt and effective home treatment, including medication, in order to prevent hospital admissions and give support to informal carers.

Crisis resolution teams have the following characteristics:

- a multi-disciplinary team
- availability to respond 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- staff in frequent contact with service users, often seeing them at least once on each shift
- provision of intensive contact over a short period of time
- staff stay involved until the problem is resolved.

#### 4. Early intervention in psychosis

The number of Early Intervention in Psychosis services rose from 16 in 2001 to 23 in 2002. The NHS Plan target is to have 50 such services by 2004. Inevitably distribution is sparse but services are better developed in the North East, Yorkshire, West Midlands and London.

Returns indicate staffing of 113.4 WTE in early intervention services but data is missing from 2 teams. The combined caseload is around 600 but capacity data is missing from 3 teams.

##### **Early Intervention in Psychosis Service**

Early intervention in psychosis services provide quick diagnosis of the first onset of a psychotic disorder and appropriate treatment including intensive support in the early years. Best practice is early treatment with low dose neuroleptics, in addition to Cognitive Behavioural Therapy and psychosocial interventions including family work.

## 5. Access to emergency assessment

Table 5 reports the different settings in which mental health assessments can be provided in an emergency and the provision of crisis accommodation.

Nationally there were 25 Walk-in clinics offering open access to emergency assessments, no change from 2000 and 2001. However, clinics were located in only 12 LITs (under 1%) and half of the clinics were found in just 2 LITs, Brent and Manchester.

The number of mental health crisis intervention teams was found to have dropped from 58 in 2001 to 52 in 2002 but remain a model of service used in 44 LITs (28%). Despite the definition, these services tend not to operate 24/7 and many focus on responding to deliberate self harm. They should not be confused with Crisis Resolution Teams (Table 3).

A & E liaison services were found to be provided in a number of ways. There were 109 hospital-based services, many of which operated beyond A&E Departments carrying out psychiatric assessments throughout the hospital. A further 152 A&E liaison services were run by CMHTs.

The number of LITs with no emergency assessment apart from the social services emergency duty team rose sharply from 14 to 32 but this can be partly attributed to the increased number of LITs and reductions in their size. Also, the new services models of crisis resolution and assertive outreach teams are providing greater 24/7 service coverage.

### Emergency Clinics / Walk-in Clinics

An open-access clinic which can provide assessment by mental health professionals and referral to appropriate agencies/services.

### Mental Health Crisis Intervention Services

Other mental health crisis intervention services providing assessment **and** intervention at times of crisis should be listed here. These services must:

- be available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week
- have dedicated staff
- hand over to other services for follow-on care and treatment.
- If crisis intervention is one of the functions of another service such as a CMHT, it should be listed as a function under that service.

### Emergency Duty Teams

Emergency duty teams are 'out-of-hours' emergency service provided by social services departments. EDTs should be included here if they have the capacity to respond to mental health emergencies and are staffed by Approved Social Workers who can carry out assessments under the Mental Health Act 1983.

### A&E Mental Health Liaison Services

A rapid assessment service for people with mental health problems who use an A&E Department. The service may be provided by a psychiatrist, mental health nurse or social worker. The characteristics of the service are that the patient will be seen rapidly, regardless of their place of origin and a risk assessment will be carried out. The service may provide follow-up care and treatment, or may refer to primary care or specialist mental health services.

## **Crisis accommodation**

The availability of crisis accommodation remained very patchy despite the very broad definition of this service which included safe houses, sanctuaries and service user-run schemes. Only 54 LITs (34%) reported such services. A total of 605 bedspaces were recorded. This was a significant increase from the previous year but this was due to more complete data being returned rather than investment in services.

### **Crisis Accommodation**

Crisis accommodation provides places for people with mental health problems in a crisis to stay overnight. Varying levels of support may be offered in a variety of settings. These settings can include mental health centres, crisis houses, service-user-run sanctuaries and hostels. This accommodation may be a short-term solution for people who live in adverse social circumstances that would make home treatment unsuitable and it can provide an alternative to hospital admission.

## 6 Clinical services

### Acute inpatient care

Of all the services mapped, the recording of inpatient provision is perhaps the most complex. It may be assumed that all LITs ensure access to acute inpatient beds but these will often be provided in facilities which are located in another LIT and shared with them. Good progress was made in starting to map this activity across LIT boundaries and this aspect of inpatient care will be targeted for further work on the 2003 mapping.

Overall in 2002, it was found that 10,463 acute in-patient beds were provided for the residents of 150 (94%) LITs (Table 6a).

**Psychiatric liaison services** were provided in 47 LITs (29%). There were 64 psychiatric liaison services in 2001 but this had reduced to 60 in 2002 and distribution indicated that this model of service had not been adopted in some areas of the country such as the South and North West. Some of the role of psychiatric liaison services was also provided by A&E liaison services in some hospitals.

### NHS day care services

The number of NHS day care services also showed a slight fall from 289 in 2001 to 268 in 2002. Fifty LITs (31%) did not report having a service. The total number of reported weekly attendances was 23,295 but the rate of attendance varied widely. Average weekly attendance was 72.6 per 100k population but this ranged from over 300 to less than 10.

### Psychiatric outpatient services

353 outpatient services were reported in 121 LITs delivering 3,241 half-day sessions per week (Table 6b). As in 2001, the most likely locations for services were CMHTs (43%) and psychiatric hospitals (32%). Primary care settings were used by only 27% of services.

NOTE: The use of zeros in the tables denotes missing data. Where this might not be clear in Table 6a, a note has been made where no data was recorded.

### Acute Inpatient Units/Wards

General acute wards may be on a general hospital site, part of a psychiatric hospital or in a purpose built separate unit. They are designed to assess and treat patients who are acutely unwell. Lengths of stay should therefore be under six months, although problems with discharge may mean that this is not achieved in practice.

### Psychiatric Liaison Services – General Medical, Surgical and Palliative Care.

Liaison psychiatry services provide psychiatric assessment and advice, training and research in general hospital settings. They may include A&E services and the assessment of deliberate self-harm. Assessments provided as part of the general on-call psychiatrist rota should not be included here. The service may also cover palliative care/hospices.

### NHS Day Care Facilities

These are often known as day hospitals and are provided by NHS Trusts. They provide a range of intervention from assessment and short-term interventions to long-term rehabilitation programmes. The range of treatment can also provide components of inpatient care, psychosocial interventions, an alternative to hospital admission, and community outreach services.

### Psychiatric Outpatient Services

While not necessarily a distinct service, these are outpatient services that are provided by psychiatrists in clinics, CMHTs and primary care.

## 7. Continuing care

Despite greater accuracy in the data collection in 2002, returns showed a drop in the number of continuing care bedspaces from 6,032 in 2001 to 5791 in 2002. The decrease was in NHS provision with the capacity of NHS residential rehabilitation units going down from over 3,100 beds to 2,785, and bedspaces in NHS 24-hour nursed care facilities falling from 2,208 to 1,958.

The capacity of non-NHS nursing homes was seen to rise with information being given on over 1000 bedspaces but this is still thought to be an underestimate as no independent registered nursing home provision for people with mental illness was reported for large areas of the country. While it is recognised that the majority of nursing home care is provided for older people and not for adults of working age, the reliability of this data has to be questioned.

Rehabilitation or continuing care teams were reported in 68 LITs (43%). They carried a total caseload of 7,330 cases, an average of 22.8 per 100k population.

### Residential Rehabilitation Unit

Rehabilitation units are non-acute NHS facilities designed to provide continuing care for people with severe and enduring mental illness who are judged to be too chaotic or unwell to tolerate the environment of a residential place in the community. While not designed for permanent residency, a small number of rehabilitation patients may effectively live in the unit for many years. The characteristics of a rehabilitation unit are:

- a hospital or community base
- 24 hour nursing care
- the provision of treatment and rehabilitation
- regular input from a multi-disciplinary psychiatric team
- the patient is under the day to day care of a psychiatric consultant.

### 24 hour nurse staffed care

24 hour nurse staffed accommodation must have all of the following features:

- at least one qualified staff on duty, on site and awake at all times
- nurses with specialist skills for the client group and setting.
- a residential site, within hospital or in the community, provided by the NHS where residents may, if required, be
- detained under the Mental Health Act
- maximum of 20 places - optimum 12
- a homely environment
- service users who may stay for several years.

### 24 Hour Staffed Care - Registered Nursing Home (non NHS)

A nursing home for people with mental health problems of working age provided by the voluntary or private sector and registered under Part 2 of the Registered Homes Act 1984.

### Rehabilitation or Continuing Care Team

These teams are multi-disciplinary and focus on the needs of people with long term serious mental illness. They will have higher caseloads than Assertive Outreach services, often in excess of 20 service users per member of staff.

## 8. Psychiatric intensive care and secure services

### **Psychiatric intensive care units (PICU)**

93 LITs (58%) reported using 105 PICU services providing a total of 719 bed spaces (Table 8). As these are specialist services, there was considerable movement between LITs in the provision of PICU bedspaces with one LIT often providing services for a number of neighbouring ones.

### **Local low secure services - high dependency units.**

Information was received on 65 low secure, high dependency units. These serve 55 LITs (34%) and provide a total of 522 bedspaces.

No information of the provision of medium secure services is included in this atlas.

### **Personality disorder services**

Two personality disorder services were recorded: The Brenchley Unit in Kent and Medway HA and Francis Dixon Lodge in Leicestershire, Northamptonshire and Rutland HA. Both were residential units.

### **Psychiatric Intensive Care Unit**

Psychiatric intensive care units provide care for the acutely unwell who need intensive nursing care in order to maintain the safety of themselves and/or others. Lengths of stays are usually in the order of weeks or maximally a few months.

### **Local Low Secure Service - High Dependency Unit**

Longer-term low secure care may be provided by slow stream rehabilitation services and other designated low secure units, in some areas referred to as high dependency units. Wards may be locked all the time or be lockable, but will have higher staff: patient ratios than an ordinary open ward. Length of stay will usually be in the order of years rather than months.

### **Personality Disorder Service**

This category includes dedicated Personality Disorder (PD) services only. The range of interventions and services provided for people with a diagnosis of PD may include some of the following elements:

- In patient beds
- Residential places (eg. In therapeutic communities)
- Day hospital places
- Individual or group therapy ( DBT, CAT, analytic)
- Supervision for NHS staff
- Supervision/ case consultation with criminal justice/probation/social care agencies.

## 9. Criminal justice and forensic services

### **Criminal justice liaison and diversion services**

128 LITs (80%) had a criminal justice liaison or diversion service. Dedicated services were available in 97 LITs (61%) and CJ liaison and diversion services were provided in 30 LITs by a CMHT or community forensic team. Overall there were 120 criminal justice liaison or diversion service (Table 9a) and 124 CMHTs and 19 community forensic teams providing a service. Referrals to the liaison and diversion teams in the months April to June 2002 were in the order of 5,660 nationally

### **Community forensic teams**

There were 42 community forensic teams working in a total of 45 LITs (28%). A further 25 LITs (16%) reported having either a CMHT, criminal justice service or other team which serviced this function.

24 LITs (15%) reported no criminal justice or community forensic services.

### **Prison Inreach Services**

Prison Inreach services were reported in 21 LITs (Table 9b) with a total of 23 services.

### **Community Forensic Services**

These are multi-disciplinary teams which support people with a mental health problem with a history of offending and/or at risk of offending. They undertake risk assessment, risk management and intervention.

### **Criminal Justice Liaison and Diversion Service**

There is a wide range of police and court diversion and liaison schemes which work with people with mental health problems who come into contact with the criminal justice system. Services characteristically comprise a dedicated nurse with a part time ASW and sessional support from a consultant psychiatrist and/or a clinical psychologist

### **Prison Psychiatric Inreach Service**

The provision of specialist mental health assessment and intervention services within prisons.

## 10. Psychological therapy services

A series of four tables (Table 10a-d) report the provision of psychological therapy services. All showed a reduced number of services since last year. This is partly accounted for by the identification of the use of services by more than one LIT.

**Psychological therapy and counselling services** were reported in 146 LITs (91%) (Table 10a). A total of 376 services were recorded with a caseload of 47,415 (147.8 per 100k population). The most frequently used settings for the services were primary care centres (47% of services) and CMHTs (27% of services). The most common orientation reported was counselling (Table 10b). This was offered by 178 services (47%). Behavioural therapy was provided in 152 services (40%). Cognitive behavioural therapy as offered by only 92 (24%) services and psychodynamic approaches by 103 services (27%).

**Specialist psychotherapy services** were reported in 73 LITs (46) (Table 10c). There were 96 services which carried a caseload of over 8,500. These services tended to be located in psychiatric hospitals.

**Voluntary/private counselling and/or psychotherapy services** were available in 101 LITs (63%) (Table 10d). There were 351 services listed. Provision was very patchy and included a wide range of services. Most common were bereavement and relationship counselling, women's therapy services, support for survivors of abuse and Mind counselling services. They largely worked out of their own premises, only 16 services working in hospital settings and 7 in CMHTs. A slightly larger number working in primary care centres.

Day centres remained an important source of therapy services with 228 offering counselling and psychotherapy sessions.

Women's therapy services are reported in Table 17b.

### **Psychological Therapy and Counselling Services**

These services provide a variety of psychological therapies such as cognitive behavioural therapy and person-centred counselling. They should be provided by appropriately qualified and accredited staff.

### **Specialist Psychotherapy Service**

These specialist and discrete services are provided by qualified and accredited (e.g. UKCP) medical and non-medical psychotherapists. Psychotherapy services include psychoanalytic, humanistic, family/systemic therapy and group psychotherapy.

### **Voluntary / Private Counselling and/or Psychotherapy Service**

Non-NHS counselling services, e.g. Relate and Cruse.

## 11. Day services

### Day / resource centres

146 LITs (91%) reported the availability of day /resource centres. Details were provided for 722 centres which had an average of 69,859 weekly attendances. These included statutory and voluntary sector provision, much of which was multi-functional providing social and therapeutic activities and advice and information services. In 502 day/resource centres a drop-in service was also provided.

In addition there were 396 **drop-ins**. These tended to be run by clubs and groups and often only operated on one or two days a week.

Another important source of day care was CMHTs. Nationally 242 CMHTs (29%) ran day services.

**Employment and training services** were available in all but 5 LITs. In total there were 451 services which showed a drop since the previous year when there were 488 services. However, with more complete data received, the capacity and functions of services was seen to have widened. Usage of services had gone up to over 20,000 users per week (Table 11b) and the different type of support provided included:

- provision of workshop facilities (41% of services)
- preparation for work (85% of services)
- skills training (73% of services)
- job finding (63% of services)
- provision of work placements (62% of services).

In addition, employment training was provided in 309 day/resource centres.

### Day Centres/Resource Centre

Day centres and resource centres are provided for people who are recovering from or living with mental health problems. The centres are usually multi-functional, offering a range of social and therapeutic activities. A wide range of services can be offered such as one-to-one support, drop-ins, advice and information and programmes of practical, social and educational activities.

### Drop-in

A flexible, informal day service which does not require regular attendance. These are often provided by the voluntary sector.

### Education and Leisure Opportunity

Opportunities for people with mental health problems to take part in education courses, to learn for pleasure and participate in leisure activities.

### Employment Scheme

Services providing training and work experience preparation for work, sheltered work placements and job finding. Clubhouses will fall into this category and services may be user run. The service may not be designed exclusively for people with mental health problems, but must provide a service tailored to their needs.

## 12. Support services

**Advice and information services** were available in 117 LITs (73%) (Table 12). There were 337 services recorded, the same number as in the previous year. Services were well distributed and showed a considerable range of types of services, many being emergency and crisis telephone helplines.

**Advocacy services** showed a slight decline from 247 services in 2001 to 238 services in 2002. Services were available in 129 LITs (81%) but were very diverse in nature. They include service user advocacy groups, volunteer projects with no paid staff, generic advocacy and more professional specialist mental health services.

The mapping includes information on a range of service user groups. The most common type of group was a **self-help or mutual aid group**. Overall there were 341 self help groups in 99 LITs (62%). The number of **service user groups** remained steady between 2001 and 2002 at 313. Nationally, 125 LITs (78%) had at least one group.

In addition, there were 155 **staff facilitated groups** but this model of service user group had not been widely developed. They occurred in only 51 LITs (32%).

### Advice and Information Service

Advice and information services such as telephone advice lines, welfare rights etc.

### Advocacy Service

Advocacy services for mental health service users can be provided using a range of models of advocacy such as citizen advocacy, peer advocacy and professional advocacy. They are characterised by the provision of an 'advocate' who will support service users to speak out for themselves or to represent users' views as if they were their own. Self-advocacy groups should be listed under service-user group.

### Befriending and Volunteering Scheme

Volunteering schemes aim to recruit, train and support volunteers to work with people with mental health problems. In befriending schemes, volunteers 'befriend' service users who are isolated by their mental illness, meeting them on a regular basis by mutual agreement.

### Self-help and Mutual Aid Group

These groups provide information and support for people who share a common interest or experience. They can fulfill a range of functions for people with mental health problems, including informal support, social networking, counselling, information exchange (e.g. Depression Alliance, Manic Depression Fellowship, and Voices Network)

### Service User Group

Groups run by service users, sometimes with paid support, whose primary function is to represent user views in the planning, delivery and evaluation of services. They are often called User Forums. These groups may also provide members with informal support and social networks, but their primary function is self-advocacy. Patients' Councils should be included here.

### Staff-facilitated Support Group

A group that is facilitated by a professional to provide support and/or social networks for people with mental health problems.

### 13. Carers' services

The mapping showed continued growth in the number of services for carers. Carers' support services (including carers' resource centres) increased from 243 in 2001 to 285 in 2002. The number of carers' support groups also increased but growth in these was slower. In 2001 there were 144 support groups and in 2002 there were 154. The number of advice and information services for carers remained the same at 337 (Table 13). Only 6 LITs were without any of these services for carers and in some localities there was evidence of good networks of carers' services becoming established.

An important source of support for carers was also found in day/resource centres but the number of these recorded had declined from 223 in 2001 to 205 in 2002.

The reduction on respite care or short break services observed in the 2001 mapping was found to have continued. Nationally there were only 63 services in 2002 and services were restricted to 49 LITs (31%) indicating very sparse distribution.

#### **Carers' Support Group**

A staff/agency facilitated support group for the carers of people with mental health problems. Carers' groups may have a range of purposes such as support, social networks, advice and information.

#### **Carers' Support Service**

Support services provided specifically for carers and families of people with mental health problems. These can include advice and information services, education and training programmes.

#### **Self-help, Mutual Aid Group for Carers**

A self-help group run by carers for carers of people with mental health problems.

#### **Short-term Breaks / Respite Care Service**

Short-term breaks which specifically target people with mental health problems may be provided primarily to give:

- relatives and friends respite from caring or
- a service user a break with care.

This can be provided in the service user's home or by the service user being cared for elsewhere. These short-term breaks away from home can be provided through fostering arrangements with other families or in appropriate staffed accommodation including hospital wards.

## 14. Home support

Dedicated **home support services** were provided in 116 LITs (73%). A total of 349 services supported a caseload in excess of 14,000 service users (Table 14), an increase of 18 services from the previous year.

However, staff employed by CMHTs and by housing agencies also frequently provided home support. Unfortunately it was not always possible to distinguish whether the home support provided by housing agencies extended beyond support to the residents of their own housing stock but the break down of provision is as follows. Home support services were provided by:

- 629 CMHTs
- 80 hostels
- 113 staffed group homes
- 178 unstaffed group homes
- 763 supported housing schemes.

Only one LIT reported no home support service from any agency.

### **Home/Community Support Service**

Home support services give practical, emotional and /or social care support to people with mental health problems and their families. The service is provided by support workers and not by mental health professionals.

Services can be attached to CMHTs and various accommodation schemes.

## 15. Accommodation

Nationally, the 2002 mapping returns indicate that there were in excess of 22,976 placements in accommodation designed specifically for adults with mental health problems. 146 LITs (91%) recorded specialist housing provision of least one of the types specified (see definitions).

**Local authority and registered residential care homes**, both local authority and independently run, accounted for 43% of accommodation placements. 1330 homes were recorded providing nearly 10,000 placements (Table 15a).

**Supported housing schemes** provided a further 42% of provision. 1072 services offered 9,638 placements and many of these schemes also provided a floating support service and support in home finding.

**Staffed and unstaffed group** homes provided only 12% of accommodation. 186 staffed homes and 225 unstaffed homes provided a total of 2,565 placements.

**Adult placement schemes** provided 438 placements, a third of which were in London. **Board and lodging schemes** only accounted for 514 placements and were only found in 13 LITs.

### Adult/family Placement Scheme

In adult placement schemes, a service user moves into an established household, in which 24-hour family-type support is provided, including on-call support at night.

### Board and Lodging Scheme

Board and lodging schemes offer alternative supported housing for people with severe and enduring mental illness.

### Hostel

Accommodation for at least six residents, providing continuous or intermediate but regular staff cover by day, and sleeping-in or no cover by night.

### Local Authority and Registered Residential Care Home

Residential care homes can be provided by local authorities, voluntary or private organisations. When they are provided in the voluntary or private sector, they will be registered as residential care homes under Part 1 the Registered Homes Act 1984. As only homes for adults of working age with mental health problems should be listed, Regulation 7 should apply which registers the home to care for people with, Mental disorder other than mental handicap past or present?.

### Staffed Group Home

These provide shared accommodation for 2-6 residents with communal living arrangements. They have continuous or intermediate staff cover by day. Night cover may be waking, sleeping or on-call.

### Supported Housing

Housing with support provided by ad hoc staff. This can take many forms and includes independent living schemes with support, shared houses with integrated support and floating support provided to people in their own homes.

### Unstaffed Group Home

Minimally supported shared accommodation for up to six residents which has communal living arrangements and a low degree of support provided by visiting staff. Staff may be on-call at night.

## 16. Mental Health Services for homeless people

### **Homeless mental health teams**

Mental health teams which work specifically with homeless people with mental health problems were found in 47 (29%) LITs. Nationally there were 66 teams supporting over 3,000 homeless individuals. Teams were run by both the statutory and voluntary sector and included functions such as home finding, crisis services, rough sleeper initiatives and a range of support and outreach work.

### **CMHTs targeting homeless people**

89 (11%) CMHTs indicated that they targeted services for homeless people. Some of these teams included a post of housing officer which in some instances is filled by a local authority housing officer who specialises in housing people with mental health problems.

### **Home finding by accommodation services**

Housing services are often multifunctional providing support, crisis and home finding services in addition to managing accommodation. A total of 340 specialist mental health housing schemes offered help in finding a home to service users. However, it is unclear if these services were only available to residents of the schemes who want/need to move on or whether they were accessible to anybody who is homeless or living in unsuitable housing.

In response to the recent launch of a strategy for the development of mental health care for women, a series of tables have been included in the 2002 Atlas highlighting the provision of women's services.

### **Acute inpatient services**

Table 17a presents information on the gender segregation of bedspaces in acute inpatient services. It provides information on bedspaces in women-only and men-only accommodation but, with the majority of beds being available for use by either gender, it is not possible to identify the total bed usage by either men or women. Hence, percentages in Table 17a refer to the whole bed complement.

Of the 10,463 bedspaces recorded in acute inpatient facilities, just 905 (9%) were provided in women only wards. A further 1,238 (12%) bedspaces were in women's accommodation on mixed wards. Overall 6,320 (60%) were categorised as beds which could be used as 'either' men's or women's beds. Although the national number of women's wards looks low, services were well developed in some areas.

### **Perinatal and mother and baby services (Table 17b)**

Nationally there were 17 perinatal mental health services and 23 mother and baby units in psychiatric services.

### **Psychological therapies (Table 17c)**

A distinction was made between women-only psychological therapy services and services which provide women-only sessions. This provision was found to be relatively undeveloped. Of the 96 specialist psychotherapy services only one was specifically provided for women and 18 offered women's sessions. Of the 376 psychology and counselling services, just 8 were women-only services and a further 33 ran women's sessions. There was a larger number of voluntary/private counselling and psychotherapy services specifically for women – 31 women's services and 43 which provided women-only sessions. The women's services included rape crisis centres and services for the survivors of sexual abuse.

### **Day services (Table 17d)**

Few day services were run for and by women. These included 18 day/resource centres, 2 education services, 2 employment services and 11 drop-ins. Women-only sessions in day services were more common. A total of 226 sessions were provided in day/resource centres, 20 sessions were run by employment services and 53 drop-ins had women-only time.

## 18. Workforce

The mental health service mapping is a rich source of information about the mental health workforce. Its most valuable features include:

- Assigning staff to specific services so enabling analysis to be carried out by geographical location, employing trust or agency and service type/function
- Identifying broad professional groupings so enabling changes in interprofessional working to be tracked
- Providing some information on qualification and status, for example, banding nurses by grade, distinguishing between approved, qualified and unqualified social workers, identifying consultant, career grade and trainee psychiatrists
- Providing ratios of staffing to both workload and locality population.

Table 18 gives an example of workforce analysis. It provides information on the professional workforce employed in mental health teams which work within the community. These include CMHT, assertive outreach teams, crisis resolution teams, early intervention teams, A&E liaison services, rehabilitation teams, all types of crisis teams, homeless services and specialist support.

## 19. Direct Payments

The Community Care (Direct Payments) Act 1996 gives local authorities the power to make cash payments for community care direct to individuals who need services. Direct payments are able to bring about improvements in the quality of life of people who would like to manage their own support. They promote independence, and they aid social inclusion by offering opportunities for rehabilitation, for education, leisure and employment for people in need of community care.

2002 saw a considerable increase in the number of mental health service users in receipt of Direct Payments. The number of individuals supported rose from 48 in 2001 to 74 in 2002. Twenty local authorities reported supporting service users by means of Direct Payments (Table 19).

## 20. Population

Establishing the population served by each LIT causes problems as not all comprise areas or aggregations of areas for which official population statistics are published. This year, for the first time, population data anchored to the results of the 2001 census were available. The populations for LITs were calculated from the 'ADS Population Estimates' used by the Department of Health for resource allocation to primary care teams (PCTs). These estimates use PCT registered populations to estimate the extent to which individuals receive their health care from neighbouring PCTs, but the total population is constrained to the national population estimate, which is census based. The age group 15-64 has been chosen as the most appropriate available estimate for services for working age adults. At the time calculations were undertaken, available figures did not allow for sub-division of the population aged 15-19. These had thus either all to be included or excluded.

Of the 304 PCTs, 288 lay entirely within a single LIT, 16 lay within two and three in three. For these the population was assigned in proportion to the 1998 electoral ward population estimates used for calculation of the populations in the 2001 service mapping exercise.

The population figures differ significantly from those used in the 2001 mapping exercise in two ways. First the data are 2001 census based. Second, the age group used for population figures for the 2001 mapping was 16-59. This was recognised to be less than ideal, but reflected the age bracketing of the only reasonably recent electoral ward level population estimates. LIT populations for the 2001 exercise had to be constructed from ward estimates, as the Department of Health had not, at that stage, published population estimates for Primary Care Organisations. Comparisons of figures presented as population in the two years exercises should be interpreted in the light of these changes.
